


# 1. Key Light


**Face the window** if you are using natural light

**TLDR**: Make your face more brightly lit than the background

Your **key light** should be about 45(ish) degrees offset in front of you.

It should be bright, **diffused**, and close to daylight in color.





#### 2. Fill Light


- **TLDR:** a smaller light that fills in shadows cast by your key light
- Put your fill light about 45(ish) degrees on the opposite side from your key light
- This can be warmer in color than your key light

# 3. Back Light

This light can **shine on you from behind** or at an angle.

Your **back light** should light you and not your background.

A hair light or a back light makes you distinct and **stand out from your background**.





# 4. Move the Mic Closer to Your Mouth

- TLDR: Sound quality is more important than image quality
- You don't have to buy anything to look and sound professional.
- If you are ready for that, Improving your mic is the first place I suggest to begin.

#### 5. Camera Angle

Put the camera at **eye level or slightly above.** 

Wide angle lenses on laptops, phones, and webcams distort close up shots.

Look your camera in the eye. This is a stand in for eye contact.











# 6. White Balance

- TLDR: White Balance is the one webcam advanced control you may want to use
- If your white balance is bad, fix it. If you can't tell, don't worry about it.
- Let's look at examples of white balance.


### 7. Don't Buy a Fancy Webcam

#### Phone camera

EpocCamHD iOS (\$)
Droidcam for Android

Video capture dongle or card \$11 to connect a regular camera to your computer Clear HDMI out from your camera





# 8. Blur your background (and other tricks)


- TLDR: Blurring your background is less jarring than a virtual background and draws the eye toward you and your message.
- Feature of software camera tools.
- I use XSplit Virtual Camera (\$40)


# 9. Use a High-Quality Microphone

If you are willing to spend money, I suggest your first purchase be a better microphone. **USB podcasting mics** are a great place to start.

**Listen to yourself** talking in the mic. Try moving the mic around your desktop until you find a sweet spot.

A less-expensive **lavalier mic** close to your mouth may sound better than a fancy mic next to the camera. (Listen and do A/B testing.)

#### 10. Find Your YouTube Voice

- **TLDR:** Talk more rapidly for recorded video than for a face-to-face conversation
- Your viewers can pause and replay parts they miss but may lack patience for anything that isn't **straight** to the point.
